

NORMATIVE NOTICE FOR THE SUBMISSION OF SCIENTIFIC PAPERS FOR THE II INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF HEALTH UPDATES - II COINSAU

The Scientific Committee of the **II INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS ON HEALTH UPDATES (COINSAU)**, with the central theme "HEALTH FRONTIERS: INNOVATION, SCIENCE AND CARE FOR A GLOBAL FUTURE", announces the following Notice No. 03/2025, which sets out the instructions and rules for submitting scientific papers.

1 SUBMISSION

- 1.1** All students regularly enrolled in undergraduate and postgraduate courses (*lato sensu* and *stricto sensu*), residents, researchers, professors from higher education institutions and professionals from all backgrounds can take part;
- 1.2** The papers will be presented in the following forms: **ORAL COMMUNICATION** and **DIGITAL BANNER**, addressing the various forms of multiprofessional action in all fields of teaching, research and extension;
- 1.3** Papers will be sent for analysis and selection from February 25, 2025 to May 9, 2025 at 23:59. Only **SIMPLE ABSTRACTS** and **EXPANDED ABSTRACTS** sent **EXCLUSIVELY** via the *internet* through the event's official *website* (<https://doity.com.br/iicoinsau>) will be accepted. Papers submitted by other means or after the established deadline will **NOT** be received or processed. After submission, the author will receive an *e-mail* confirming receipt of the work;
- 1.4** The academic work produced by the author and co-authors (if any) must be submitted **ONLY ONCE** by the **MAIN AUTHOR** who, consequently, will be the **PRESENTER** and directly responsible for it;
- 1.5** **É MANDATORY FILL IN ON SITE, AT MOMENT OF (PLEASE DO THIS CAREFULLY, AS IT WILL BE USED FOR THE PERMANENT PRODUCTION OF THE CERTIFICATE).**
- 1.6** Authors/presenters of scientific papers must be registered for the II COINSAU. Papers approved without the proper registration of authors/presenters will be **AUTOMATICALLY DISCLOSED**;
- 1.7** Members of the event's organization are allowed to participate as authors and co-authors in the registered works. Their work will be eligible for honorable mention, but will not be eligible for prizes;

- 1.8** Papers must be composed of a maximum of **1 AUTHOR** and **6 CO-AUTHORS**, which means that there will be a maximum of 07 participants per paper;
- 1.10** As **MAIN AUTHOR**, each participant will have the right to submit up to **2 SIMPLE ABSTRACTS** and **2 EXPANDED ABSTRACTS**. FOR CO-AUTHORSHIP THERE WILL BE NO LIMIT;
- 1.11** The option of presenting the work orally is the responsibility of the **MAIN AUTHOR**, and it is **OPTIONAL** to wish to present. For this purpose, option will be available at the time of submission and must be selected by the **AUTHOR**. If the option is not selected, the oral presentation of the work will not be included in the event program, and this will **NOT** imply any damage to the production of the AUTHOR's certificate;
- 1.12 THERE IS NO CHOICE OF PRESENTER**;
- 1.13** Those involved in the conception of a scientific paper to be submitted to the II COINSAU must be duly registered for the event, according to the table below:

Number of authors in the paper	Required number of registered authors
01 to 04 Authors	At least the main author must be registered for the event
05 Authors	The main author and one more (01) co-author registered for the event
06 Authors	The main author and two others (02) co-authors registered for the event
07 Authors	The main author and three others (03) co-authors registered for the event

- 1.14 Authors may not submit research in progress, only completed research;
- 1.15 If the work is approved, in order to guarantee its presentation or exhibition, the main author must be duly registered for the event;
- 1.16 Work involving **HUMAN BEINGS** must be approved by the **RESEARCH ETHICS COMMITTEE (CEP)**, and must be accompanied on the day of the presentation by a statement from the **CEP** confirming that it has been approved. If it is **NOT** presented, the work will be automatically disqualified;
- 1.17 Work involving animals must be approved and numbered by the **COMMITTEE ON ETHICS IN THE USE OF ANIMALS (CEUA)**, and must be proven on the day of presentation by submitting **the CEUA** declaration. If **NOT** presented, the work will be automatically disqualified;
- 1.18 **The scientific paper will be registered by filling in the submission form available on the event's website, and all fields must be filled in.** Special care must be taken with the *email* addresses and names provided, as they will be used in all communication between the congress committee and the person responsible for the work;
- 1.19 At the time of submission, the author must attach the work **WITHOUT** the identification and **WITH** the identification of the authors as requested in Microsoft Word format (**.DOC, .DOCX**);
- 1.20 **FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE ABOVE RULES WILL AUTOMATICALLY DISQUALIFY THE WORK AND IT CANNOT BE PRESENTED OR PUBLISHED.**

2 TYPES RESEARCH AND SUBJECT AREA

- 2.1 The following types of studies can be submitted:
- 2.1.1 Case study;
- 2.1.2 Field study;
- 2.1.3 Ecological or demographic study;
- 2.1.4 Survey;
- 2.1.5 Experimental research;
- 2.1.6 Technological prospecting;
- 2.1.7 Experience reports;

2.1.8 Literature reviews (systematic, integrative, among others).

2.2 When submitting the abstract, the author must base it on the central theme and choose one of the axes below:

Central theme: Frontiers of Health: Innovation, Science and Care for a Global Future.

Thematic Axes:

2.2.1 Technological and Digital Innovations in Health;

2.2.2 Environmental Challenges and Global Health;

2.2.3 Social Challenges and Health Determinants;

2.2.4 Free Themes.

3 THE SUMMARIES

3.1 Abstracts may be submitted in the form of a SIMPLE ABSTRACT of at least 350 words and no more than 600 words (not including the title, authors' names, affiliations, e-mail, category, keywords, subject area and references; only the body of the text) or an EXPANDED , which should be no less than 4 pages and no more than 6 pages, following the templates presented in **ANNEX I - Simple Abstract Template** and **ANNEX II - Expanded Abstract Template**, which are available in editable format-on the event website (<https://doity.com.br/iicoinsau>).

3.2 The abstract must be written in **PORTUGUESE, ENGLISH** and **SPANISH**.

3.3 Only abstracts sent electronically via the event website in **WORD** format (.DOC, .DOCX) will be accepted. Papers submitted by other means will not be accepted.

3.4 Once the abstracts have been sent, there will be a charge of R\$35.00 (thirty-five reais) to change or include the author's details. The author must send a detailed *e-mail* to the organization informing them of the need to make changes. So be careful when submitting, take your time and proofread before sending.

3.5 Repeated works recognized by the scientific committee will be excluded from the system. The organization will consider the first paper sent with the original, excluding the others, when the problem is observed before the paper is sent for correction.

3.6 We are not responsible for ethical problems between authors. Therefore, in the event of conflicts of interest, once a paper has been approved for presentation it will not be

removed from any publication or list made by the publisher.

3.7 If not under the conditions mentioned above, at no time will you be allowed to delete a paper after submission.

3.8 A FORMATTING OF SUMMARY MUST BE FORMATTED AS FOLLOWS FOR THE BODY OF THE WORK:

3.8.1 The SUMMARIES SIMPLE e EXPANDED should be written in **PORTUGUESE, ENGLISH and SPANISH;**

3.8.2 Justified alignment, 3 cm top margin, 3 cm bottom margin and 2 cm on the right and left margins, **single spaced;**

3.8.3 Font: Times New Roman, size 12;

3.8.4 The title should be short and informative (maximum 15 words or two lines) centered, in size 14 and with **ALL** letters capitalized and in bold;

3.8.5 The name of the author and co-authors must be entered in full and without abbreviations as will be done in the specific fields on the submission site, in Times New Roman, size 10, left justified and in bold. The academic title must be written in Times New Roman, size 10, right aligned;

3.8.6 The body of the abstract should follow the sequence below:

- **INTRODUCTION:**
- **Simple summary:** an overview of the subject, indicating the relevance of the research.
- **Expanded abstract:** should be brief and contain the problem studied in a clear way, using VANCOUVER-style citations.
- **OBJECTIVES:** both abstracts (simple or expanded) should contain a presentation of the aims of the study, and in the expanded abstract, this section should be explicit within the introduction, in the last paragraph;
- **METHODOLOGY OR METHODS (choose one according to the research method):**
- **Simple summary:** description of the procedures used to carry out the research, such as location, sample, protocol, statistical treatment, among other aspects that the author considers necessary.
- **Expanded abstract:** should be concise but sufficiently clear so that the reader understands and can reproduce the procedures used. It should contain references to the study methodology and/or laboratory analyses used. In the case of research

involving human beings, provide information on the ethical aspects, including the number (CAAE) of the Research Ethics Committee approval protocol.

- **RESULTS AND DISCUSSION:**

- **Simple summary:** highlight the results achieved in the study, correlating them with current literature and in accordance with the proposed methodology.
- **Expanded abstract:** the discussion of the results must be based on and compared with the literature used in the research work, indicating its relevance, advantages and possible limitations and in accordance with the proposed methodology.

- **CONCLUSION OR FINAL CONSIDERATIONS (choose one according to the Research Method):**

- **Simple summary:** present the answers to the research objectives.
- **Expanded abstract:** should be written with the verb in the present tense, in short sentences, without additional comments, and based on the objectives and results of the abstract.
 - **KEYWORDS:** a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 5 keywords should be inserted at the end of the abstract, separated by (;) with the first letter capitalized and the rest in lower case in alphabetical order. The keywords can be selected according to the Health Sciences Descriptors (DeCS) on page a (<http://decs.bvs.br/>);
 - **BIBLIOGRAPHICAL REFERENCES:** The abstracts should present the references according to the **VANCOUVER** rules and should be organized as follows:

- **Simple abstract*:** minimum 03 and maximum 05 references;

- **Expanded abstract*:** minimum 08 references;

*The **SIMPLE SUMMARY** should **NOT** contain quotations throughout the body of the work;

*The **EXPANDED SUMMARY** must include citations throughout the body of the text, respecting the VANCOUVER standard (which are indicated by Arabic numbers in the text, which correspond to numbered references in the list of references - for example: ¹, Silva¹, (Silva¹, 2025).

*References must be justified, single-spaced, size 12, and presented in the order in which they are cited in the body of the text.

3.9 The use of graphs, tables, images and quotations in the body of the **SIMPLE**

SUMMARY is not permitted.

- 3.10** Footnotes are not allowed.
- 3.11** Authors and co-authors will be responsible for spell-checking the abstract presented at the time of submission.
- 3.12** Submission will only take place if the data is filled in properly and completely, without abbreviations, the gaps requested on the website.
- 3.13** In the event of omissions in this notice, structure according to **VANCOUVER** rules;
- 3.14** The papers submitted will be evaluated a Scientific Committee made up of selected evaluators.
- 3.15** Only original work will be accepted, i.e. work that has never been published in another event or journal.
- 3.16** The evaluation committee will use the *PLAGIUS software* - plagiarism detector, version 2.5.4, free to *download*, adopting a *tolerance of 3%* for simple and expanded abstracts.
- 3.17** Abstracts submitted outside the required formatting will be automatically rejected. All abstracts submitted in accordance with the rules will be evaluated. Papers will not be accepted if they violate the code of ethics or Resolution 466/12 of the National Health Council, which establishes the criteria for research involving human beings, or the ethical principles of animal experimentation defined by Law No. 11,794 of October 2008.
- 3.18 PAPERS ACCEPTED FOR ORAL PRESENTATION WILL RECEIVE A SPEAKER'S CERTIFICATE.**
- 3.19** The authors of the papers undertake, together with the event's scientific committee, to appear on the platform on the date and time set for the presentation; if they do not appear, they will lose their presentation certificate.
- 3.20** Certificates will be issued based on the information provided at the time of submission. The organizing committee cannot be asked to correct the name/title of the work, or to include/exclude an author, if the mistake was made by the author at the time of submission (except for payment of the fee described in section 3.4).
- 3.21** Papers not presented will **NOT** receive certificates.
- 3.22** If the participant withdraws from the event, they will not be refunded the registration fee.
- 3.23** All the abstracts approved, presented and exhibited will be published in the Proceedings of the **II INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF HEALTH UPDATES (II COINSAU)**, with ISSN, editorial prefix, catalog and publication in 3 languages (Portuguese, English

and Spanish).

4 SELECTION

4.1 Entries will be disqualified:

4.1.1 Sent in any format other than Word;

4.1.2 No authors' titles;

4.1.3 Work without a professional supervisor (in the case of undergraduate students);

4.1.4 Missing information, e;

4.1.5 Work without the proper registration of the authors according to the table.

4.2 The papers submitted will first be evaluated by a committee of qualified professionals, duly accredited by the scientific committee, distributed by area training, based on the abstract submitted for evaluation.

4.3 The judging of the presentation is the sole responsibility of the scientific committee, based on the precepts of the judging panel made up of professionals in the field, and following the criteria below:

4.3.1 Adequacy to the issues pertinent to the central axis of the congress;

4.3.2 Posture/behavior during the presentation (points will only be awarded for this requirement when the presenter has the camera open);

4.3.3 Objectivity and mastery in the presentation of results;

4.3.4 Relevance and scientific originality of the work;

4.3.5 Proper use of time;

4.3.6 Oral expression skills;

4.3.7 Describe the title precisely to the content of the abstract;

4.3.8 Relationship between the written summary and the oral presentation;

4.3.9 Formatting and compliance with the requested structure (introduction, objective, method or methodology, results/discussion, conclusion or final considerations, keywords and references);

4.3.10 Theoretical and practical knowledge;

4.3.11 Quality of writing: Spelling and grammar;

4.3.12 Organization of the text: Clarity and objectivity.

4.4 Judging will be carried out on standardized forms, with scores for each of the evaluation items.

4.5 Under no circumstances will the scores obtained by the works be revealed at the time

of selection or presentation, nor will their evaluators be identified.

- 4.6** The scientific committee will not have access to the names of the authors or the institution to which they belong. This process is confidential and its decision will be final.

5 ORAL PRESENTATION

- 5.1** The 20 (twenty) best **WORKSHOPS will compete for prizes** and will be evaluated in oral presentation format and included in the **GENERAL SCHEDULE OF THE II COINSAU**.
- 5.2** Presentations will take place via **Youtube and Google Meet**, with the day and time of the presentation being sent in advance along with the access *link* to the presenter's e- mail address indicated when the work was submitted.
- 5.3** The work will be accompanied by a monitor and two evaluators.
- 5.4** The works that are not selected to compete for the award must be presented in simultaneous rooms at **Google Meet**.
- 5.5** The presenter must present the work in the presence of the monitor on the scheduled day and time. The absence of the presenter at the time of the judging will result in the automatic disqualification of the work.
- 5.6** The presentation format will be in the form of **SLIDES**. The *slide* template will be made available in advance on the event *website*. The first *slide* should contain the title and full name of the authors.
- 5.7** *Slides* should be prepared in **Microsoft PowerPoint Presentation** format ("**ppt**").
- 5.8** The standardized *slides* will be organized according to the structure below:
- 5.9 Title:** with easily legible capital letters, centered, bold and without abbreviations;
- 5.10 Author, co-authors and advisor:** below the title in smaller letters, with the first name being that of the main author, followed by the others and the name of the advisor;
- 5.11 Body of the slide:** should contain content structured into: introduction, objectives, materials and methods, results and final considerations.
- 5.12 References:** the main references used in the work should be formatted in the standard **VANCOUVER** style.
- 5.13** The presentation time limit will be a minimum of 5 minutes and a maximum of 6 minutes.

5.14 In the event of unforeseen circumstances with the presenter, one of the co-authors may present the work, notifying the organizing scientific committee in advance (48 hours before the presentation).

5.15 Once the presentation times and platform have established, they cannot be changed.

5.16 The authors of the selected papers undertake, together with the event's Scientific Committee, to appear on the platform on the date and time set for the presentation.

5.17 All presenters of papers in the oral communication modality will receive a certificate as a **SPEAKER** at the end of the event.

6 PENALTIES

6.1 The time limit for presentations will be strictly respected.

6.2 If there is a delay until the specified time, the work will be automatically disqualified.

7 EXHIBITION - BANNERS

7.1 The works will be exhibited on the event's website and social networks.

7.2 The date and *link* for sending the *banners* will be sent by *e-mail*.

7.3 All *banners* must be sent in **PNG** or **JPEG** ("**image**").

7.4 All *banners* must be identified where required with the title and name of the main author.

7.5 **If the author does not send it in, the work will not receive a certificate.**

8 FINAL PROVISIONS

8.1 Papers approved and presented at the **II CONGRESSO INTERNACIONAL DE ATUALIZAÇÕES EM SAÚDE (II COINSAU)** will compete for an academic award (HONORABLE MENTION), as well as an additional award to be defined by the organizing committee, with the exception of papers which one or more members of the event's organizing committee participate.

8.2 Three (3) papers will be selected from each type of presentation (**ORAL COMMUNICATION** and **DIGITAL BANNER**) and will receive their awards at the event's closing ceremony.

8.3 Registration implies agreement and acceptance of all the clauses and conditions

established. Any cases not covered by these regulations will be referred to the event's scientific committee.

- 8.4** Only one (01) certificate will be issued per paper submitted. Certificates will be sent to the *e-mail addresses* registered by the authors.
- 8.5** **Please note:** all materials produced about the abstracts (proceedings, certificates, etc.) will be a faithful reproduction of the information submitted by the author. Therefore, no changes can be made to the spelling of the title, abstract or authors after the deadline for submitting papers. Please note that the information provided is the sole responsibility of the author submitting the abstract.
- 8.6** The authors and co-authors of the works acknowledge and declare, assuming all legal responsibilities, irrevocably and , that all the the information provided, as well as the content of the submitted work, is true, proper and original.

The body of the abstract should be justified, in TIMES NEW ROMAN font, SIZE 12, 1.0 (single) line spacing and contain a minimum of 350 words and a maximum of 600 words (not including the title, authors' names, affiliations, e-mail address, keywords, thematic axis and references - **only the body of the text**), should be submitted on A4 paper, in a **Microsoft Word** file (.DOC or .DOCX) The text should be in a single paragraph and should NOT include figures, tables, graphs or quotations. Acronyms and abbreviations, when used for the first time, should be preceded by their full meaning. E.g. Federal University of Pernambuco (UFPE). The simple abstract must be submitted in Portuguese, English and Spanish. **Objective:** Presentation of the aims of the study, meeting the proposed theme. **Methodology:** Divide this topic into the type of study, the location of the research, the characteristics of the participants, the procedures, the outcomes, a description of the equipment/exercises, the statistical analysis and (if available) the approval number of the local ethics committee (number/year) or other topics deemed necessary according to the type of study, without the use of subtopics. **Results and discussion:** Be sure to present the most relevant results for understanding the work, describe the findings and compare the new discoveries with the knowledge already obtained. The full paper should have a minimum of three and a maximum of five references. Abstracts with images, graphs and/or tables will not be accepted. **Final considerations:** Present the main answers to the research objective. Without repeating the results.
